What is the Title I Program?

Title I is the largest federal aid program for elementary, middle, and high school. Through Title I, the Federal Government gives money to school districts around the country based on the number of at-risk students in each district. The purpose of Title I is to ensure that all children have a fair and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education.

Title I is based on three important ideas:

1. All students should work toward the same high standards.
2. Local districts, schools, and parents/guardians know best what their students need to succeed.
3. Parents are partners in helping all students achieve.

Benefits of being a Schoolwide Title I Program:

The main benefit of being a School-wide Title I Program is that the school receives additional funding in order to provide educational services for all its students.

How we use our Title I funds:

Title I schools have a choice as to how they set up their Title I program as long as the program helps students meet the state academic standards. Title I funds can be used for the following:

- Provide after-school programs
- Train teachers and other staff
- Purchase equipment and learning materials
- Support parent involvement
- Family Academic Programming
- Hire Additional Instructional Staff
