

### **Benefits of Immersion**



Research shows that learning an additional language in a Dual Language Immersion Program leads to higher:

- → Cognitive Development
- → Sociocultural Development
- → Economic Benefits
- Academic Achievement on standardized assessments and in language acquisition for all students



### **BSD Achievement Data**

- BSD students in DLI averaged higher growth and proficiency percentages than students in traditional classes in Math and Reading on Smarter and NWEA MAP assessments
  - MLL students in immersion classes show greater growth than MLL peers in traditional classes
- Middle School Immersion Language Proficiency scores are higher than the national average in Listening, Speaking, and Writing on the AAPPL assessment

- Reviewed the high schools' capacity and attendance feeder data





### **Family Interest for Continuation**


## **Family Survey Responses**






Families provided feedback on the high school immersion model. They expressed a willingness to:

- Pay for Dual Enrollment








## **High School Location**

- Continue the Immersion program at BHS for Fall 2024 & 2025
  - First two cohorts numbers are each one class size
  - Majority of these students feed to BHS
  - BHS leadership already planning
- Expand to CHS & MPHS starting in Fall 2026
  - The first cohorts from all three elementary schools
  - A full class size will feed into each of the high schools



## **High School Model**

- One Spanish course per year with embedded supports
  - 9th grade AP Spanish
  - 10-12th grade College Dual Enrollment Spanish course
- High School credits awarded from Middle School courses
- Spanish Foreign Exchange opportunity
- Work Based Learning & Volunteering credit options
- Delaware Certificate of Multiliteracy awarded

## **School Choice Questions**

BHS is not my attendance zone/feeder school. Do I need to apply for School Choice during Open Enrollment?

No – regardless of your address, all Immersion students have the right to remain in the program.

Will BSD transportation be provided for my child?

BSD attempts to provide all choice students us transportation at the nearest feeder bus stop to your house. Families need to contact the BSD Transportation office.

What if my child does not attend BHS?

The College Dual Enrollment course will only be offered at Brandywine High School until the program matriculates to Concord and Mount Pleasant.

Students must complete two credits of the same foreign language for graduation in Delaware. This can be earned through their middle school APPLL score, Spanish 4 & AP Spanish (potentially offered at MPHS due to IB), or taking a new language. Please consider that most universities require three World Language credits in

high school.

#### AP Capstone Program

**AP**Capstone

Brandywine High School is proud to be an approved AP Capstone™ school, one of the few in Delaware to reach this designation. AP Capstone is a diploma program based on two year long AP courses: AP Seminar and AP Research. These courses are designed to complement other AP courses that the AP Capstone student may take. Instead of teaching specific subject knowledge, AP Seminar and AP Research use an interdisciplinary approach to develop the critical thinking, research, collaboration, time management, and presentation skills students need for college-level work. The College Board developed the AP Capstone Diploma program at the request of higher education professionals, who saw a need for a systematic way for high school students to begin mastering these skills before college. In order to earn the AP Capstone Diploma, students must score 3 or higher in AP Seminar, AP Research, and four additional AP exams of their choosing.

Brandywine High School has been recognized for the 2023-2024 AP School Honor Roll by the College Board. This award is given to schools nationally for developing an AP program that creates a college-going culture and gives students opportunities to earn college credit and maximize their college outcomes.



#### **AVID Program**

AVID's (Advancement Via Individual Determination) mission is to close the opportunity gap by preparing all students for college readiness and success in a global society. AVID is a 9th-12th grade pathway and school-wide support system designed to prepare students in the academic middle for college. The AVID curriculum, based on rigorous standards, is driven by the WICOR method, which stands for Writing, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, and Reading.





Career & Technical Education

CTE programs give students a chance to explore careers that they might be interested in after graduation. They allow students to take classes that they enjoy and earn a credential recognized in their field. These programs encourage students to pursue these career-related options after they graduate, either in college or in the workplace.

## Fine Arts, Music, and Dance

#### **Fine Arts**

The Visual Arts Department teaches students how to develop a visual voice to speak about their lives. Experiences and lessons help students learn how art can improve their ability to communicate ideas and feelings about their world. Lessons combine examples from art history and culture with creative experiences to express themselves visually. The department offers a wide variety of course selections from traditional drawing, painting, and sculpture to the more cutting-edge art forms like computer art and photography.

Students create, evaluate, and make connections between the visual arts and other disciplines. Lessons are based on Big Ideas that transcend art and make connections to the greater world. Opportunities are provided for students to explore arts' place in the working world. At the same time, the Art Department supports students preparing for an art career as well as those who simply want to experience art.

The Art Room is a place where students feel safe to try new ideas and express feelings in productive ways. The Art Room is a haven where students can believe in themselves. Art can be transformative, enlightening, and fun.









## Fine Arts, Music, and Dance

#### Music

The Brandywine High School Music Department provides students with great vocal and instrumental music ensembles. Kids get the opportunity to perform in seasonal concerts and special events. BHS also offers supporting classes in music like Music Theory and MIDI technology classes.

BHS wants our students to develop as musicians both individually or as part of an ensemble. Our students are able to read music and have a working knowledge of music theory and composition.

Our faculty teaches music with different styles. They focus on historical and cultural styles that are the roots of today's music.

## Fine Arts, Music, and Dance

#### **Dance**

The Dance Department offers a wide variety of classes including Exploratory Dance, Ballet, and Jazz. Dance education begins with an awareness of body movement and its potential for self-expression. Students do exercises and movements designed to teach them the practical applications and the creative interpretation of dance. Students learn that techniques, attention to the nuances of movement, and artistic discipline help them create more powerful and professional expressions.

The development of BHS's courses is based on State and National Dance Standards. This makes sure that high academic expectations of knowledge and performance is taught. Students learn that dance is the product of intentional and well though physical actions. Students learn about historical and cultural dance. They develop their ability to evaluate and assess dance.
